SDS Plans November Vigil For Peace

Many Americans are refusing to accept responsibility for their actions and for actions taken in their name. America is waging an undeclared war 8,000 miles overseas, a war which has cost over 28,000 U.S. dead and untold numbers of Vietnamese slain. Many of us will not accept this as being our concern. We must recognize that this is our war, being waged in our name. We must individually bear responsibility for America's actions in this conflict.

War brutalizes. It brutalizes those who stay at home as well as those who fight in it. We accept low death tolls instead of demanding no death tolls. We accept chemical warfare but worry about air pollution. What has happened to our humanity? Where is the violence in the world today - is it not in people who can condone such a war as we fight in Vietnam?
